Myanmar Conference 2020: “Minorities in Myanmar”

Stuttgart, 21.-23. May 2020

The Myanmar Conference 2020, jointly organized by the Linden-Museum Stuttgart and the Myanmar-Institut e. V., will take place at the Linden-Museum from 21 to 23 May 2020.

The conference will have a focus on the topic “Minorities in Myanmar” and especially invites papers relating to ethnic, religious, political, cultural or social minorities (for example, Kachins, Muslims, punks, communists, LGBTIQ people, artist communities... to name but a few examples) their situation, identities, traditions, practices, strategies and politics as well as related topics, such as Myanmar ways of accommodating - or not accommodating - pluralism, the peace process and NCA negotiations, intercommunal conflicts and dynamics, minorities in the educational system and its curricula, the controversial “laws for the protection of race and religion” and much more.

The conference committee invites individual abstracts in Myanmar, English or German language from academics, researchers, graduate students and professionals with an interest in Myanmar. While we hope to receive many proposals for presentations relating to the conference theme, we will also try to accommodate papers not directly related to the above topics.
